Pastor's Letter

Today we come to the last day of October - **Halloween!** For the past month I have been in the school classrooms each Tuesday reminding the children that Halloween is ***NOT*** the devil's birthday. **Halloween is the night before All Saints Day** and it was formerly known as "**All Hallow's Eve.**" It is a time that we celebrate **the lives of the saints.** So, if your children and grandchildren want to get all dressed up and celebrate the holiday, please remind them of the significance of the saints in our lives. And let us use the lives of the saints as examples in our lives!

Today is also the end of our formal **Parish Stewardship Campaign**, in which members of our parish community have encouraged us to ask God how we might share our time, our talents, and our treasure with our parish community. Since we began our Stewardship Campaign we have seen a slight increase in our Collections, but we are still not receiving enough to cover our parish expenses. We have discussed this situation at our Parish Finance Council meetings and at our Parish Pastoral Council meetings and we have agreed to continue to emphasize **Stewardship** through the rest of this year. If our Collections are still not covering our parish expenses, we will then have to look at ways in which we can reduce our expenses. Hopefully it will not come to this, but many parishes in our Archdiocese have had to reduce their expenses, and this has adversely affected the way that they are able to carry out their ministry of proclaiming the Gospel. I do not want to see that happen here at Holy Name of Jesus Church.

In today's Gospel the tax collector, **Zacchaeus**, welcomes the Lord into his house, and **he then promises to give half of his possessions to the poor.** That is incredibly generous. The Bible calls us to share **10%** (the concept of tithing). **But Zacchaeus promises to give 50%! I do not give 50% to the church and other charities, but I do give 20% each year.** Could I give more? Yes, and before I ask others to give more, I should do the same myself. **And I will.** Just as when I invite parishioners to visit the sick and the elderly, I realize that I must visit them first - then I can ask parishioners to visit those who are unable to join us for Mass. It is the same with Stewardship.

During the Stewardship presentations that we have had at all of our Masses this month, the speakers asked us to increase our donations each week, in accordance with what we are able to give. However, half of our registered parishioners give less than \$1.00 per week. If you are not already making regular donations to Holy Name, would you be willing to give our church at least \$5.00 per week? Or \$10.00 per week? And if you are currently giving more than that, would you be willing to increase your donations so that we can cover our parish expenses?

We are so blessed to have the parish community that we have here at Holy Name of Jesus Church. And we are most grateful to each of you for whatever you give each week. During this coming week, as you ask God in prayer to guide you on the amount you are willing and able to give, I invite you to keep in mind the many blessings that God has bestowed on each of us. God gives us much more that we can ever give back!

May the lord continue to bless us always and in all ways, *Father Paul*



Holy Name of Jesus School News! **2010 Annual Fund Appeal**

HNOJ School wants to thank our parishioners for the generous assistance they provided last year and urge all to give the same or a larger amount this year.

Flu, Pneumonia & Pertussis Vaccine Clinic

Vaccines help prevent people from getting sick. They also help reduce the spread of disease to others and prevent epidemics. There are many kinds of vaccines. Each vaccine is made up of parts of weakened or killed bacteria or viruses of a specific disease. After you have a vaccine, your body's immune system makes antibodies to fight the disease. If you are exposed to the same disease in the future, the antibodies kill the bacteria or viruses before they have a chance to make you sick. If you get a vaccine, it may not completely prevent you from getting a disease, but it makes it much less likely. If you get a disease even after you have been vaccinated, it usually will be only a mild case. Vaccines are usually given by shot (injection). Some are given by mouth as a pill or liquid, or by a spray (aerosol) into the nose. Vaccines are also called immunizations.

Join L.A. County's Public Health Department staff in the parish hall to get your vaccinations and to ask any questions you may have regarding the flu, pneumonia and pertussis.
