### Pastor's Letter

When I was discerning a call to the priesthood, one of the great influences on my journey was a priest who celebrated Mass at Central Juvenile Hall: Father Greg Boyle, S.J. He is such a spiritual man who is able to reach the hearts of gang members and others who had been locked up "in the hall." Twenty years ago, in 1990, Father Greg began a program known as "Homeboy Industries" in order to provide jobs for youth who were not quite employable in mainstream society. But Father Greg's motto is: "Nothing stops a bullet like a job!"

Earlier this year Father Greg published his first book, entitled, "Tattoos on the Heart: The Power of Boundless Compassion." In each chapter Father Greg tells the stories of young men and women who have turned their lives around, and those who have been victims of senseless violence. We all know that violence is not the will of God, and Father Greg helped bring a message of peace and nonviolence to the gang members of Los Angeles.

For many years Homeboy Industries survived by the generous donations of people all over the world who wanted to help Father Greg empower these young people to achieve a sense of self-worth and to make changes in their lives so that they could become productive citizens. Father Greg has been featured on television programs such as "60 Minutes" and has been invited to bring some of the homeboys to the White House to meet the President and First Lady. He has really helped a lot of young people recognize that they are made in the image and likeness of God, and that each person is valuable, "no matter what."

Unfortunately, the Los Angeles Times of Friday, May 14th, reported that, due to budget constraints, Homeboy Industries is going to have to lay off 75% of its employees, including all senior staff and administrators. This amounts to over 300 of the 400 employees that they had a month ago. This tragic development is one more indication of how the recession of the past three years is having its greatest impact on the poor and the youth of our society. Next Sunday Sister Margaret Farrell of Covenant House will be speaking at the 10:00 Mass about what Covenant House does for homeless youth in Hollywood. Like Homeboy Industries, Covenant House is feeling the effects of our economic recession, and they are doing their best to help the most vulnerable youth of our community.

Let us continue to pray for the youth of our world, and to reach out to them just as the Lord reaches out to us.

May the Lord continue to bless us always and in all ways, Father Paul

### **Choose You Encourages Women to Take Action to Help Prevent Cancer**

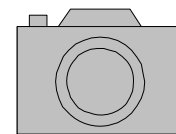
The American Cancer Society's new *Choose You* program is designed to inspire women to put their health first in order to stay well and help prevent cancer.

The American Cancer Society has launched a new nationwide movement to shine the spotlight on a sobering statistic: one in three women will get cancer in her lifetime. *Choose You* is designed to inspire women to take action and put their health first in order to stay well and help prevent cancer.

According to the American Cancer Society, about half of all cancer deaths could be prevented if people maintained a healthy weight through diet and regular exercise; avoided tobacco products; and got recommended cancer screening tests. Unfortunately, it's not always easy to incorporate these healthy behaviors into a busy lifestyle. In fact, a new national survey of approximately 2,000 women ages 25-64 revealed that they are so busy being caretakers of others, they have little time to take care of their own health.

"Women hold the keys to cancer prevention because they are the Chief Medical and Chief Operating Officers of their individual households. But they really struggle to make their own health a priority," said Elizabeth T.H. Fontham, M.P.H., Dr.P.H., immediate past volunteer president of the American Cancer Society. "We are launching *Choose You* to help motivate women to prioritize their health and engage in lifestyle behaviors that can help reduce their cancer risk. By committing to their health, these women will be better able to care for their families and serve as role models for their children, families, and friends."

Millions of toys are out there and hundreds of new ones hit the stores each year. Toys are supposed to be fun and are an important part of any child's development. But each year, scores of kids are treated in hospital emergency departments for toy-related injuries. Choking is a particular risk for kids ages 3 or younger, because they tend to put objects in their mouths. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) closely monitors and regulates toys. **Did You Know?****Five Steps to Safer Environments**

The Archdiocese mandates that all people who work with children and youth in our parishes and schools must undergo child abuse prevention training through the VIRTUS program. The training details five steps to prevent child sexual abuse: Know the warning signs of an inappropriate relationship with a child.

1. Know the warning signs!
2. Control access to children by carefully selecting the adults who work with children and youth.
3. Monitor all programs for the safety of children and youth.
4. Be aware of and sensitive to what is going on in the lives of children.
5. Communicate concerns to the appropriate person in authority.
