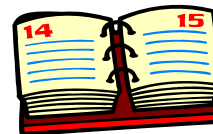

Pastor's Letter

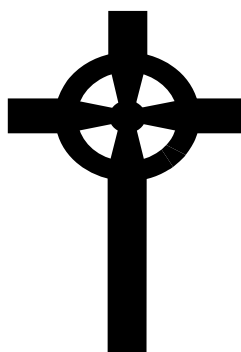
Last Wednesday, **May 27, 2010**, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles held a special Mass to welcome our new **Coadjutor Archbishop, Jose Gomez**. *There were over 4,000 Catholics in attendance, including seven Cardinals, 59 Bishops, and 411 priests.* It was a historic event in the life of the Catholic Church in Los Angeles, as Archbishop Gomez is the first Hispanic Archbishop in the history of the Archdiocese. And this is significant because over 70% of the Catholics are Hispanic and the Archbishop clearly understands their culture.

However, what was clear to me is that the new Archbishop wants to reach out to all of the Catholics of our Archdiocese, and during the Mass he clearly pointed this out; with a sense of humor that you do not usually see from those in prominent positions in the hierarchy of the Church. Archbishop Gomez said that he wants to learn as much as he can about the people of the Los Angeles area during his time as Coadjutor Archbishop. And when Cardinal Mahony retires next February, Archbishop Gomez will then take over as Archbishop.

Will Archbishop Gomez become a Cardinal some day? In all likelihood he will, but that may not happen for a few years. It is traditional that the Archbishop of Los Angeles be named a Cardinal by the Pope, but Cardinal Mahony was our Archbishop for five years before he was given the red hat of Cardinal.

As I was praying with my brother priests at this Mass, I looked around and saw the diversity and deep spirituality of the Catholics of Los Angeles. And, today, as we celebrate the **Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ**, we continue to reflect upon the Christ-centered nature of our Church. For the church is not a building - the Church is the people of God! So let us all continue to pray for Cardinal Mahony, Archbishop Gomez, and all of those who help guide us on our journey of faith.

May the Lord continue to bless us always and in all ways, *Father Paul*

Got Hay Fever? Get to Work!

Hay fever slams us every spring: Can't breathe; can't think; can't even hear very well. Do you call in sick or drag your fuzzy-brained self to the office? Or do you simply pop an allergy pill and get on with your day?

At least one out of every 5 Americans suffers from allergies. Common causes of allergy symptoms include food allergies such as peanut allergy or milk allergy, and seasonal allergies resulting from grass, weed, tree pollen, or various molds. Cat allergies and dog allergies can also cause miserable symptoms such as itchy eyes, sneezing, nasal congestion, and wheezing. Allergic skin conditions can cause a rash and itchy skin.

Allergies Can Hit Hard

What we know as "hay fever" is known medically as allergic rhinitis. Over the spring and summer, trees, grasses, weeds, and ragweed release their pollen. If you're sensitive, your immune system will send an army of histamines on attack. Histamines are chemicals that trigger inflammation in the sinuses, nose, and eyes.

It's a downward spiral into fits of sneezing, congestion, postnasal drip, runny nose, and itchy eyes. You may feel worse on some days than on others -- depending on what's blooming, the pollen count, and your sensitivities.

"What slows people down is the fuzzy feeling in your head ... which makes you feel disoriented, disconnected, makes it hard to focus," Pacheco says.

Pollen Patrol in Your Environment

Avoiding contact with allergens-- like pollen -- is the tried-and-true advice that allergists give to patients. You can control your exposure to pollen at home, in the car, and outdoors. Here are a few suggestions:

At Home

- ❖ Keep windows closed and use air-conditioning.
- ❖ Cover air-conditioning vents with cheesecloth to filter pollen.
- ❖ Use high-efficiency particulate air filters (HEPA).
- ❖ Clean air filters frequently and air ducts at least once a year.

In the Car

- ❖ Keep windows closed.
- ❖ Set the air conditioner to use recirculated air.

Outdoors

- ❖ Minimize walks in wooded areas or gardens.
- ❖ Stay indoors as much as possible on hot, dry, windy days when pollen counts are highest
- ❖ Stay indoors between 5 a.m. and 10 a.m., when pollen counts are usually highest.
- ❖ Wear a mask when mowing the lawn or gardening.
- ❖ Don't hang linens or clothes out to dry.

DID YOU KNOW?**Possible Indicators of Child Abuse and Neglect**

A key to reporting child abuse and neglect is being able to recognize common indicators. In a parent, the following signs may signal the presence of child abuse or neglect: shows little concern for the child, blames the child for the child's problems in school or at home, asks teachers or other caretakers to use harsh physical discipline if the child misbehaves, sees the child as entirely bad, worthless, or burdensome. Did You Know?**Five Steps to Safer Environments**

The Archdiocese mandates that all people who work with children and youth in our parishes and schools must undergo child abuse prevention training through the VIRTUS program. The training details five steps to prevent child sexual abuse: Know the warning signs of an inappropriate relationship with a child.

1. Know the warning signs!
2. Control access to children by carefully selecting the adults who work with children and youth.
3. Monitor all programs for the safety of children and youth.
4. Be aware of and sensitive to what is going on in the lives of children.
5. Communicate concerns to the appropriate person in authority.
