## Pastor's Letter

Earlier this week I was sitting with **my sister and brother-in-law** on the boat dock outside their home in **St. Petersburg, Florida**. We were watching the boats floating by on their way into Tampa Bay and somehow the topic of conversation turned to **Holy Name of Jesus School**. Each one of the four children in our family benefited from Catholic education and I have shared stories with my siblings about the blessings that we have in our parish school. I have told them about the elements of faith formation, about the quality of our educational curriculum and the joys that the children experience in our art and music programs. Then my sister asked, **"Then why is the enrollment so low - is it an issue of tuition?"** And I answered, **"Yes, in this economy that is exactly what it is. Many of the families in our community simply cannot afford to pay for a Catholic education for their children."**

**The next morning my sister gave me a check for ten partial scholarships!** She said, **"No child should be denied a Catholic education because of this economy. The parents should pay what they can and these scholarships can help those who are truly needy."** What a blessing to have received this check!

So, if you are in a financial situation that prohibits your child from attending Holy Name of Jesus School, please call me and we will meet with our Principal, Mrs. Belisle, to see if we can provide your child with a **"Pastor's Scholarship."** There will be a **"financial needs assessment"** analysis done for each family and priority will be given to families with children entering **Kindergarten through fifth grade**. The **first** scholarships will go to children whose families are active members of our parish, the **second** group of scholarships will be given to families who attend Catholic churches that no longer have Catholic schools (such as St. Agatha, St. Anselm and St. Brigid) and the **third** group of scholarships will be given to families who live in our community but worship at other churches. So, if you know anyone who has told you, **"I wish I could afford to send my children to Holy Name of Jesus School"** then **please have them call me!**

Providing a Catholic education to our children is an integral part of the mission of our Church, and we will do all we can to educate as many children as possible!

#### FDA Warns Not to Eat Nestle Toll House Prepackaged, Refrigerated Cookie Dough

On June 19, 2009, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) warned consumers not to eat any varieties of prepackaged Nestle Toll House refrigerated cookie dough due to the risk of contamination with *E. coli* O157:H7 (a bacterium that causes foodborne illness).

#### What to Do

- Throw away any prepackaged, refrigerated Nestle Toll House cookie dough products you may have in your home.
- Do not cook the dough because you might get the bacteria on your hands and on other cooking surfaces.
- Contact your health care professional immediately if you or your family have recently eaten the dough and have had stomach cramps, vomiting or diarrhea, with or without bloody stools.
- If you have additional questions about the recalled products, contact Nestle consumer services at 800-559-5025 or visit the company's Web site.

#### What Action Has Been Taken?

- Nestle has voluntarily recalled all varieties of prepackaged, refrigerated Toll House cookie dough and is fully cooperating with the ongoing investigation by FDA and CDC.
- CDC is conducting an ongoing study with the help of several state and local health departments.

Since March 2009, there have been 66 reports of illness across 28 states. Of 25 people who were hospitalized, 7 have a severe complication called Hemolytic Uremic Syndrome. No one has died.

#### About *E. coli* O157:H7

- The bacteria cause stomach cramping, vomiting, and diarrhea, often with bloody stools.
- Most healthy adults can recover completely within a week.
- Young children and the elderly are at highest risk for developing Hemolytic Uremic Syndrome, which can lead to serious kidney damage and even death.

#### Safe Food Handling

FDA reminds consumers they should not eat raw food products that are intended for cooking or baking before eating. Use safe food-handling practices when preparing these products, including

- following package directions for cooking at proper temperatures
- washing hands, surfaces, and utensils after contact with these types of products
- avoiding cross-contamination
- refrigerating products properly

**DID YOU KNOW?****INTERNET FILTER SOFTWARE IS NO SUBSTITUTE FOR PARENTAL MONITORING**

There is a lot of material on the Internet that is inappropriate for children. Parents can use filtering software to protect children from that material, but filters do not guarantee that children will not be exposed. A filter will never be a substitute for parents' presence. Monitor your child's online behavior. Keep your family computer in a highly visible, common area like the family room or the kitchen. Ask your children to show you what sites they go to, and be open and willing to discuss the inappropriate material they might come across.
