DID YOU KNOW?
RECOGNIZING SIGNS OF CHILD ABUSE AND
NEGLECT

A key to reporting child abuse and neglect is being able to recognize common indicators. In children, the following signs may signal the presence of child abuse or neglect: shows sudden changes in behavior or school performance, has not received help for physical or medical problems brought to the parents' attention, is always watchful as though preparing for something bad to happen., is overly compliant, passive, or withdrawn, comes to school or other activities early, stays late and does not want to go home.
